


Introduction

- Tokyo meeting The meeting held on 15 January 2008 agreed to conduct the assessment survey as presented.
- Aids to Navigation Fund Committee Meeting held on 16 – 17 April 2008
- The meeting agreed the involvement of a third party to determine the status and the extend of repair and maintenance that are necessary.
- The Nippon Foundation agreed to contribute about US\$1.351million for this assessment survey.



Scope of Work

- The assessment survey will be conducted by each individual State and third party expert.
- An estimated time frame for the survey is six (6) months commenced from June to November 2008.
- The type of Aids to Navigation are as follows:
 - a. Resilient Light Beacon (RLB),
 - b. Lighthouse,
 - c. Light buoy; and
 - d. Light beacon.

Scope of the Third Party Expert

- The MSC expert will assist and advise the littoral states in carrying out the following survey activities:
 - a. Preparation of detailed schedule,
 - b. Carrying out the inspection work of AtoN,
 - c. Assessing the condition of AtoN,
 - d. Making a draft plan for future renewal and repair work of AtoN,
 - e. Gathering existing useful data, including cost estimates for renewal, repair and maintenance work of AtoN.
 - f. Preparation of final reports.
