2	Cooperation and capacity building on Hazardous and Noxious Substance (HNS) preparedness and response in the Straits of Malacca and Singapore
3	Demonstration on projects of Class B Automatic Identification System (AIS) Transponder on small ships
4	Setting up a tide, current and wind measurement system for Straits of Malacca and Singapore to enhance navigation safety and marine environment protection
5	Replacement and maintenance of aids to navigation in the Straits of Malacca and Singapore
6	Replacement of aids to navigation damaged by tsunami incidents
