## **Background**

**Marine Safety Review Committee** formed following 3 incidents in early 2014, all incidents occurring within 2 weeks

29 Jan 14 - Collision between chemical tanker & containership

30 Jan 14 - Contact between containership & barge

> 10 Feb 14 – Collision between containership & chemical tanker

**Safety Review Committee consisted** the following parties: Maritime and Port Authority of Singapore Ministry of Transport Academia Industry

Findings highlighted the common thread of human element in incidents

Safety at Sea

Lack of situational awareness

Poor judgment and human error identified as main cause of accidents

# **National Maritime Safety at Sea Council**



## Formation and background of NMSSC

- Council comprises industry leaders from a wide spectrum of the maritime industry to spearhead and sustain safety efforts
- To promote and build a progressive safety at sea culture by addressing both human and non-human elements that contribute to maritime safety
- Long term plans include international collaboration with other centres of excellence



## Information Video – Safe Passage for the Singapore Strait

- To instill a strong safety culture, enhance communication and promote information sharing
- To promote safe navigation practices in the Singapore Strait
- To assist ship master and officers in passage planning
- To familiarise ship masters and officers on local environment and traffic conditions

## **AIS-B** and ECS on Small Craft

- Small craft will have enhanced situational awareness of the marine traffic in their vicinity
- Ocean-going vessels are now able to detect and identify small craft
- Improved security through positive identification of small craft
- MPA's Port Operations Control Centre able to readily access AIS information




## **Safety Projects**


### **Revision of pilot boarding grounds**

- Measure to enhance safety of navigation
- Introduce scheduling system for vessels arriving at pilot boarding ground

#### Prototype lifejacket receptacle for regional ferries.

- Project to standardise and enhance storage of lifejackets on ferries
- To facilitate quick removal and donning of lifejackets in an emergency
- Potential for implementation of concept on other ferries and harbour craft

#### **FEREX 2015**

- Extended invitations to our partners, DGST Indonesia and Marine Department Malaysia, to participate in Safety Forum and to observe FEREX in Singapore
- Participation of over 350 participants from 10 agencies and companies
- 15 craft despatched and 100 "role players" rescued
- Full Troop Exercise including deployment of equipment and personnel at seaward incident location and landing point
- Table Top Exercise at Emergency Operations Centre













