




Background

The "Safe Passage for the Straits of Malacca and Singapore" pamphlet was launched at IMO on 20 May 2014.

39th TTEG agreed to Singapore's proposal on the next step to produce a video for the safe passage in Singapore Strait to be jointly developed by Indonesia, Malaysia and Singapore.





A Safety@Sea Initiative

- The safety video is part of the Safety@Sea initiatives to improve the safe passage of vessels by:
 - Raising the level of safety awareness.
 - Instilling a strong safety culture to the shipping community.
 - Enhancing communication and information sharing











Objective of the Safety Video

- The video presents useful local information particular to the Singapore Strait.
- It provides local and international users of the Singapore Strait a reference, highlighting navigational guidelines and best practices for safe conduct of passage.
- The information serves to help those who may be less familiar with navigating the Singapore Strait, in particular those who are visiting for the first time.







Key Elements

- This is a three-part training resource package, which comprises of 2 videos and an interactive computer-based training module.
- Both videos and computer-based training follow a transit through the Traffic Separation Scheme from east to west and west to east, highlighting:
 - Precautionary areas where crossing traffic is most often encountered;
 - Hazards along the various parts of Strait;
 - Tidal and weather conditions that can present a challenge to navigation; and
 - Assistance provided by professional Vessel Traffic Information System.
