Development of the CM

- C/ES 24 (November 2007) considered outcome of Singapore Meeting and:
- Agreed IMO should contribute to implementation of CM
- Authorized S-G to:
 - assist in attracting sponsors for projects
 - promote financial contributions for AtoN
 - continue the work on the protection of vital shipping lanes

IMO Role in the CM

Pursuant to C/ES 24 decisions, IMO's role in the CM varies subject to situation and respective component:

- CF: IMO as observer with advisory function, representing IMO Member States' interests and guiding on IMO matters of purview
- PCC: IMO either as observer or, if IMO Fund contributes to projects, as sponsor and member
- ANF: IMO either as observer or, if IMO Fund contributes, as sponsor and member of ANF Committee



IMO M&SS Trust Fund

Purpose of IMO Fund:

- Not in competition with CM components
- Complementary to funds established under CM
- JTA provides interface between CM and IMO Fund
- Following signature of JTAIMO Fund provides funding to projects to facilitate their progress and to ANF

Projects Status

- Project 1 : Determination of risks and removal of wrecks.
 Awaiting final results from MEH hydrographical survey; potential interest by India, Germany and US
- Project 2: Response to ship-source HNS pollution incidents.
 Some overlap with MEH project; IMO prepared ToR; needs assessment by US; supported by Australia, EU, China & US;
 HNS database and decision support system in place –EU
 IMO Fund to facilitate implementation
- Project 3: Trial of AIS Class B transponders for small ships
 Some overlap with MEH project; support by Australia, Japan, RoK & IMO;
 IMO Fund covered costs for 20 transponders


- Project 4: Tide, current & wind data collection & processing.
 Some overlap with MEH project; support by Australia, China India & US; additional gauges from the MEH be included in the project
- **Project 5:** Replacement, maintenance and repair of 51 existing aids to navigation.
 - Principle relevance to MEH project; establishment of AtoN Fund; support by Japan; RoK, UAE, MENAS, MSC & NF; assessment survey conducted; cost estimates prepared
- Project 6: Support towards a Concept study on feasibility of establishment of Emergency Towing Vessel Service (ETV) Completed
- **Project 7: Marine Electronic Highway support**
