


## INTRODUCTION - SHIPPING TREND

Vessels Reporting to VTS Port Klang 2013 - 2018



- Variety products carried on board ships transiting the Straits;
- 2. 2016 to 2018 statistic beyond 80,000 ships;
- 3. Slightly increase more than 13,671 ships between 2009 and 2018;
